We are proud to announce that following the bid we have successfully been awarded a grant of £75,840 from the National Lottery Heritage Fund for an exciting new project, 'Silverdale Colliery – A Fitting Tribute.'

The project will see Silverdale Mining Tribute restored and a series of community heritage activities taking place, culminating in a community celebration to commemorate the Tribute restoration.



Thanks to National Lottery players, the project will restore Silverdale's Mining Tribute and host a series of creative community heritage activities, including a lantern parade and open air community theatre performance, for people to take part in. The project will also be looking for people to interview about their memories of the Working Men's clubs that were an important part of Silverdale's past. 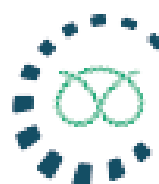

Summer Reading Challenge 2019 – Space Chase

The Summer Reading Challenge encourages children aged 4 to 11 to read six library books during the long summer holiday.

Children's reading can 'dip' during the summer holidays if they don't have regular access to books and encouragement to read for pleasure. The annual Summer Reading Challenge helps get three quarters of a million children into libraries each year to keep up their reading skills and confidence. The Challenge celebrates its 20th anniversary this year.

How it works

Children can read whatever they like - fiction, fact books, poetry, joke books, picture books, audio books - just as long as they are borrowed from the library.

Children receive special rewards each time they finish a book and there's a certificate for everyone who completes the Challenge.


The Summer Reading Challenge is open to all primary school aged children and is designed for all reading abilities. It starts in Staffordshire on the 13th July and continues until just after the children return to school after their summer holidays.

There is a different Summer Reading Challenge theme each year.

The Summer Reading Challenge 2019 theme is Space Chase, an out-of-this-world adventure inspired by the 50th anniversary of the first moon landing.

SILVERDALE PRIMARY ACADEMY PICKS THE DONNA LOUISE TRUST AS ITS CHOSEN CHARITY

The Donna Louise Trust has been chosen as Silverdale Primary Academy's first dedicated charity, with the Staffordshire school already planning a range of fundraising activities over the next year.

Whilst the academy regularly holds fundraising events, up until now it has never had a dedicated charity – a situation that has changed after the school's Head Boy and Girl called on parents to help them identify a worthy recipient of their charitable efforts.

And following a recent vote at the school, Donna Louise, which provides hospice care for children and young people, has been picked as Silverdale Primary Academy's dedicated charity, set to benefit from the school's charitable activities.

Author Ed Hilton gets Play published about Silverdale Miner

Keele University student and Staffordshire playwright Ed Hilton has just had his first play published about Silverdale's own Joseph Cook. Throughout the three years conducting research Ed was fascinated by Cook's story: his rapid rise to the position of Prime Minister after he emigrated to Australia in 1885 with his family, and wanted to capture the drama of Cook's life.

Although Cook spent the majority of his life in Australia, he started out working at the No. 6 pit or the 'Big Pit' in Silverdale aged 9 and was forced to become the breadwinner in his family after his father died in a pit accident at Hollywood mine. By speaking out against dangerous working practices and supporting injured miners, he became involved in politics after leaving England. He then became Australia's sixth Prime Minister in 1913 and went on to have a distinguished career afterwards, including involvement in the 1919 Paris Peace Conference.

One hundred years ago as a delegate from Australia, Joseph Cook signed the Treaty of Versailles which ended the First World War. So, it is a fitting centenary to get the play about Cook's life story published. It is a fantastic, local story that deserves wider recognition.

The play is being published by North Staffordshire Press and went on sale on 25th May 2019 held at a book launch at the New Vic Theatre. In addition, Ed is working with local drama groups to help bring the play to the stage, including a showing in Silverdale, which gives us all something to look forward to.



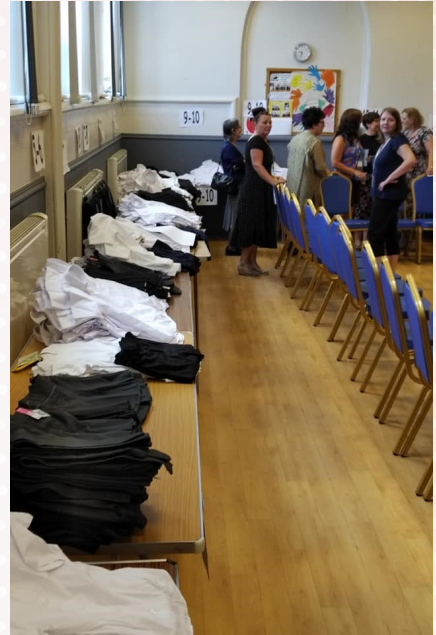
Picture: Ed Hilton outside Joseph Cook's house in Newcastle Street Silverdale showing the plaque.

Community Speed Watch in Silverdale Parish



As the Engagement Coordinator for Community Speed Watch (CSW) in Staffordshire and Stoke on Trent I'm often asked about the aims and objectives of the initiative and the process should a repeat offender be identified.

The Aims and Objectives are simple:

To help local people address speeding problems in their own area

Increase driver and public awareness of the dangers of speeding

Improve community safety

Speeding is a major concern in most residential areas and by having a group in your area it offers an excellent opportunity for the community to come together and help support the Police identified hotspots and repeat offenders.

CSW schemes comprise of trained volunteers in the use of a hand held radar device which is used at pre-identified site locations to check vehicle speeds. Registration numbers, makes or models of vehicles exceeding the speed limit are recorded and passed to the Police and educational warning letters are issued.

Most drivers who receive a warning letter take note of its content and change their behaviour, realising the importance of obeying to the speed limits. In 2018 stats show that under 5% of drivers were caught for a second time and under 1% for a 3rd time.

Drivers who are identified as a repeat offender are placed on an escalation process where they will receive a home visit by an officer, after which time they will be targeted for enforcement if they are caught again. In 2018 officers carried out 54 home visits with zero vehicles identified as having been caught a 4th time.

Staffordshire and Stoke on Trent have over 70 active CSW groups. The efforts of the 400+ volunteers should not be underestimated as collectively they are all making a valuable contribution towards road safety and are an important part of the policing family.

Option 2—A larger, concrete-surfaced skatepark with more opportunities for BMX riders, scooters and skateboarders

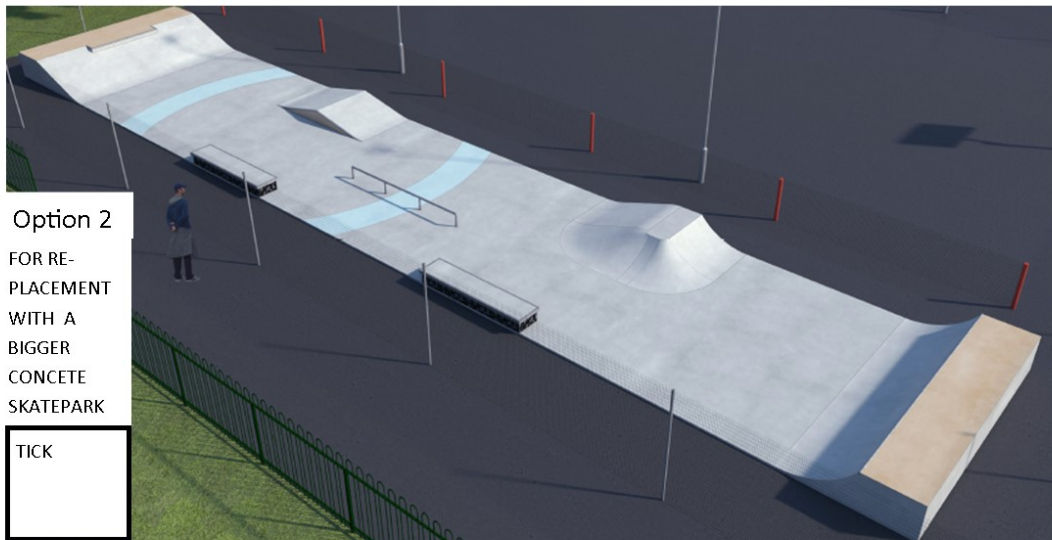

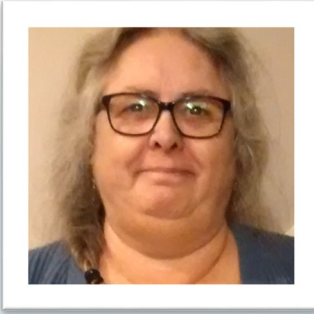

Tina Spence

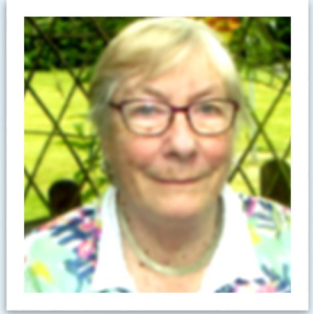


Tina has lived on Parksite since 1987, and with her husband and two sons now runs a business importing and retailing handicrafts, textiles and furniture from India.
