Pepper Street/Scot Hay Road Mini roundabout

The Parish Council believe the mini roundabout by Heritage Park has been poorly designed, which results in vehicles cutting in front of approaching cars to turn right, or just not stopping when they should. There have been several road traffic accidents and near misses since its installation, most of which go unreported to the Police. Of greater concern though is the number of near misses involving children walking to/from school, reported by the parents and lollipop lady. Shocking evidence has been gathered over recent months which supports this. This has now been presented to Staffordshire County Council. County Councillor David Jones has now instructed a traffic survey of the area, which will monitor the speed and use of the roundabout. The findings will be used to assess what is required. The Parish Council will continue pressing Staffordshire County Council to make it safer for all.

Budget News 2018/19

Last year the Parish Council was faced with the difficult decision to increase the Precept (annual charge paid to the Parish Council via the Council Tax) by approx. 13p per week per property. The Parish Council are now consulting on the draft Budget for 2018/19, which will be approved at the 11th January 2018 meeting. The Miners' Wheel

One of the main projects this year has been to raise the funds needed to refurbish and relocate the pit wheel at the entrance to the Silverdale Country Park (former Silverdale Colliery site). Since planning permission was granted, we have received funding through the Tesco 'Bags of Help' fund and have just received the successful outcome of bid to Red Industries. Meanwhile, firms have been approached to tender for the work. Now the final amount has been raised, the wheel will be refurbished and put in its final resting place during the early part of 2018.

Miners' Tribute

Another big project undertaken by the Parish Council includes the refurbishment of the tribute – which was installed 20 years ago when the Colliery closed. Unfortunately, the tribute needs TLC and requires a substantial amount of money to bring it back to its prime. The Parish Council are working on a funding application to the Heritage Lottery Fund to fund the work and also a community event celebrating the history of the Colliery. This will take a lot of time and resource to put the bid in, but if it is successful it will be well worth it.


